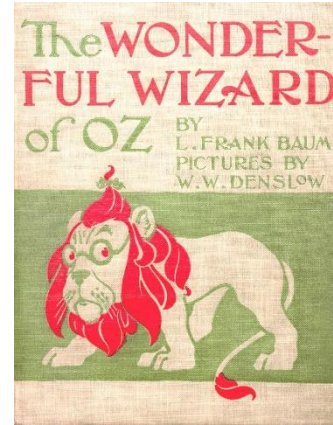


Teatime with Jane - Booklist 2024-2025:

L. Frank Baum

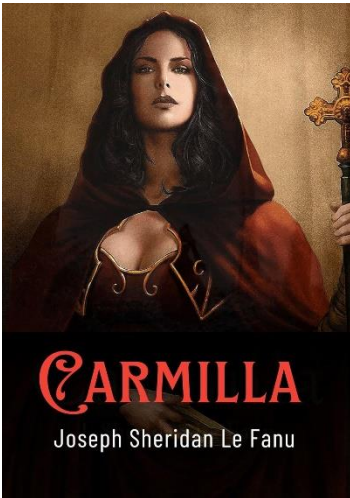

Joseph Sheridan Le Fanu

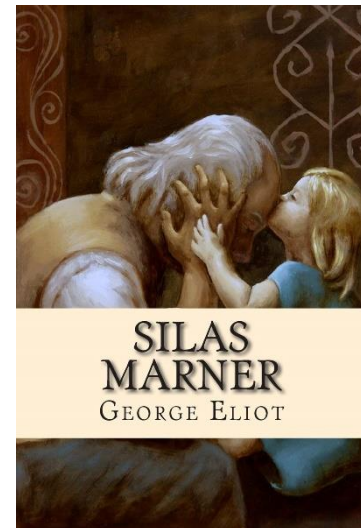

George Eliot

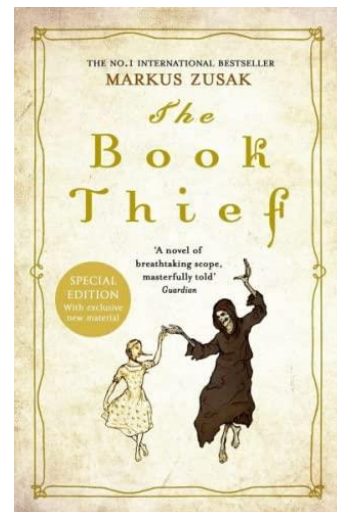

22 January: THE BOOK THIEF

1939. Nazi Germany. Death has never been busier - and will become busier still. By her brother's graveside, Liesel's life is changed forever when she picks up a single object, abandoned in the snow. It is The Gravedigger's Handbook, and this is her first act of book thievery. So begins Liesel's love affair with books and words, and soon she is stealing from Nazi book-burnings, the mayor's wife's library . . . wherever there are books to be found. But these are dangerous times, and when Liesel's foster family hides a Jew in their basement, nothing will ever be the same again...

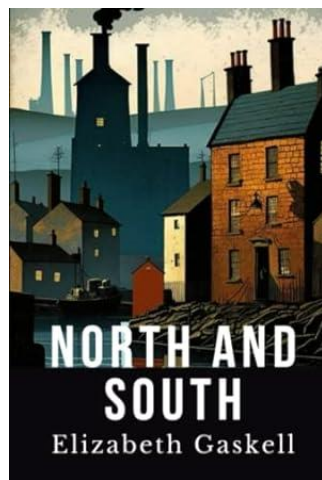


19 February: NORTH AND SOUTH

Margaret Hale is a strong-willed and independent young woman who was raised in the south of England. When Margaret's father, a minister, decides to leave the church and move the family to Milton, she is thrown into a dirty, strange world of factories, industrial conflict, and social unrest.

In these new and unfamiliar surroundings, Margaret struggles with her growing feelings for John Thornton, a wealthy mill owner and fierce opponent of the striking workers.



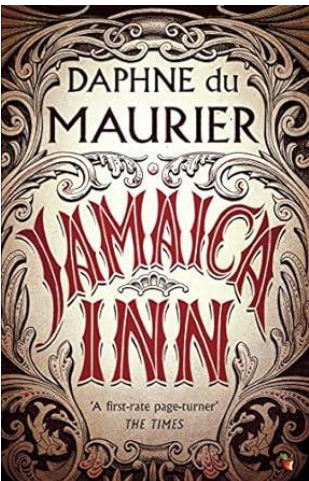
19 March: JAMAICA INN

Daphne du Maurier

Mary Yellan crosses Bodmin Moor to Jamaica Inn. Her mother's dying wish was that she take refuge there with her Aunt Patience. The warning of the coachman echoes in her mind.

When Mary discovers the inn's dark secrets, the truth is more terrifying than anything she could possibly imagine and she is forced to collude in her uncle's murderous schemes. Against her will, she finds herself powerfully attracted to her uncle's brother, a man she dares not trust.

Jamaica Inn is a dark and gripping gothic tale reminiscent of *Jane Eyre* and *Wuthering Heights*.

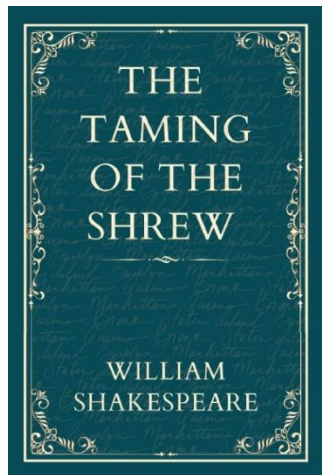


23 April: THE TAMING OF THE SHREW

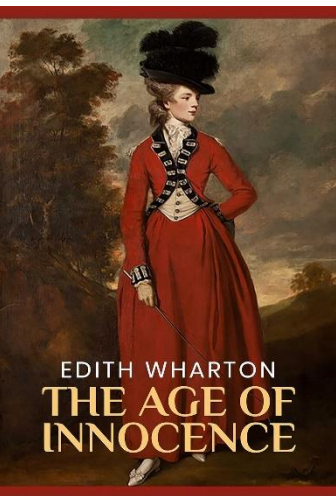
